Northern Virginia amateur Jim McGuire, 51, of Haymarket finished late on a sweltering afternoon with a 4-under-par 68 on the Country Club of Virginia's James River course yesterday. He holds a one-stroke lead on amateurs Keith Decker, 50, of Martinsville and Allen Barber, 51, of Yorktown and Lake Chesdin Golf Club head PGA professional Tim White, 51.

The leader board after David Partridge of Manakin and Tim Kelley of Ashland and PGA professionals Mike West of Richmond, Jon Corliss of Virginia Beach (2008 Senior State Open champ), Mike Movers of Stanardsville and Bud Lintelman of Purcellville shot 71 and are three shots behind.

> Virginia Tech golf coach and defending champion Jay Hardwick, PGA professional from Blacksburg, and reigning U.S. Senior Amateur champion Vinny Giles of Richmond were in with 72.

> McGuire is one of 37 amateurs in the field who earned a spot through qualifying. He had six birdies and two bogeys in his first appear-

ance in the tournament.

Decker, who has won 17 major VSGA titles, also is playing in his first Senior State Open. Barber was the second low amateur in last year's Senior State Open.

The James River layout's slick, speedy greens were the talk of the opening round.

"The greens are really, really good and really, really fast," Barber said.

Said White, who didn't have a three-putt, "You don't get a chance to play greens this fast and this good often. You have to be careful."

Reigning State Senior Stroke Play and State Senior Amateur champion Glenn Mullian was well off the pace with a 76.
